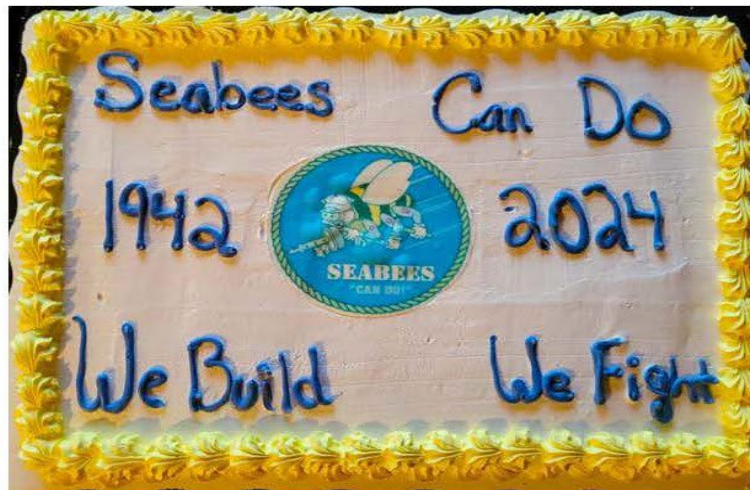

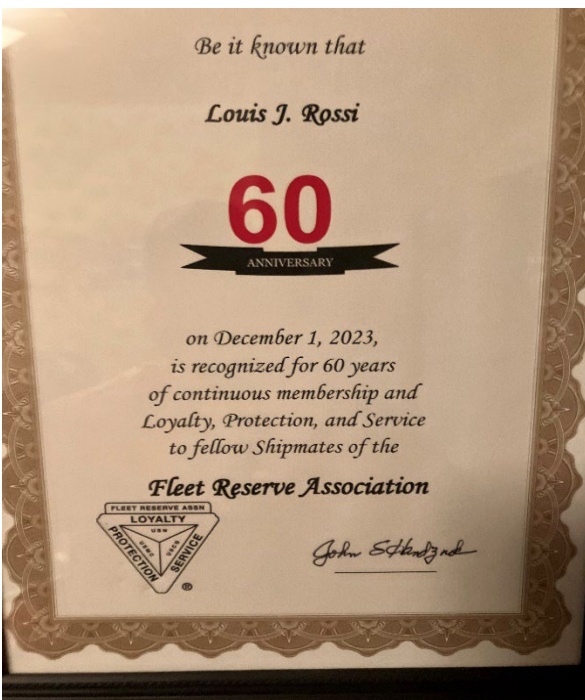

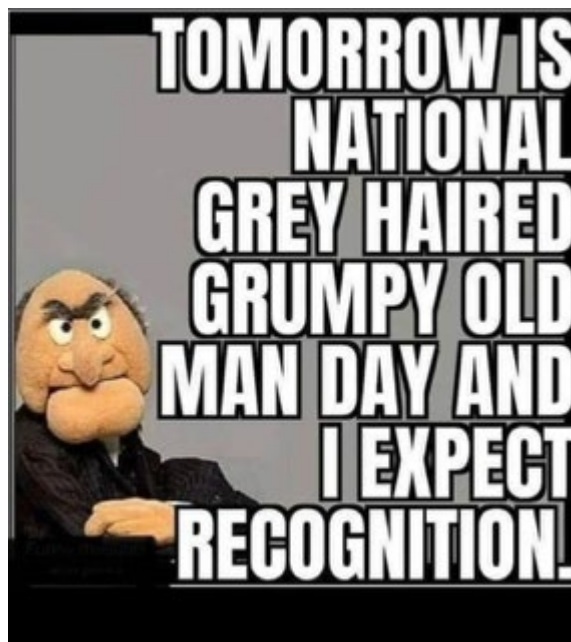

Island X-19 Daytona, FL Refurbishes Seabee Monument

In June 2019, Island X-19 of Daytona, Florida procured and dedicated our Seabee memorial monument for the nearby Cape Canaveral National Cemetery. In five years, our monument already shows the affects from the rugged weather conditions (especially the sun) with almost all the engraved lettering and the big working Seabee center section bleached out rendering the letters unreadable. We undertook the task to restore the lettering as well as highlighted features on our monument. Below is what we did; we pass this info along as a guideline if your Island happens to have the same circumstances:

1. Before you actually start work on the monument, first obtain permission (verbal should be fine) from the Cemetery Director as your Seabee monument, like ours, was officially transferred to the National Cemetery and became Government property. The Director will certainly be happy to learn that you want to pull maintenance/upkeep on the monument as their staff will not have the manpower for this task.

2. Here is a list of materials that we needed in the restoration (not in order of their use) and yes, molasses is a key ingredient:

- a. Roll of painter's tape and newspaper to protect the vertical sides of the monument from over spray.
- b. 9" foam paint roller (short nap is important) and paint pan.
- c. Small jar of dark molasses
- d. Regular size can of black (high gloss) Krylon spray paint
- e. Paint scraper (box cutter with razor blade works great)
- f. Dawn dish detergent and minimal water to wash down after paint/molasses removed.
- g. Rags
- h. Gallon jug (maybe two) of tap water

3. First thing to do is hold a good soap (like Dawn) & water field day on the monument face to get the general surface grit & grime off. Then follow with the proverbial boot camp toothbrush scrubbing in all the engraved lettering and emblems. Rinse well with water. BYOW just in case no hose bib is nearby. We actually held field day a couple of days in advance, so the monument face was thoroughly clean & dry.

4. When dry, begin skirting with newspaper and painters' tape around the vertical sides of the monument to guard against over spray. Try to do the entire procedure as early as possible in the day (when the Cemetery is open) so the monument is still cool as possible.

5. Pour about a cup of molasses into the paint pan. With your 9" paint roller, gently roll across the entire top face of the monument. Do not press hard as it is important that no molasses run into the engraved lettering "valleys." Let that stand for about two minutes.

6. Next, with the Krylon high gloss black spray paint, spray over all the lettering and emblems. Obviously, no need to spray the blank areas on the face. Let it dry.

7. Now you are ready to start scraping off the molasses along with the over spray residue paint which is on top of the molasses. Two people can do the scraping operation simultaneously if you are careful. Use razor blade scrappers. Spackle knives are not sharp enough. The molasses will have set up on the flat faces so use short smooth strokes. Wipe off residue from your scrapper onto your rags.

8. When the paint in the lettering and big emblem has had at least 45 minutes to dry, you can use a damp (but not soaking wet) rag with some dish detergent to wipe the flat surfaces to remove the left-over streaks and brown sheen from the molasses.

9. Site cleanup and your monument is ready for several more years of honoring our departed Seabees.

After the initial cleanup, the painting, scraping and final cleanup only took about 2-1/2 hours. (we had an ideal day to do this weather wise)

WREATHS HONOR 85 FALLEN SEABEES

Around December 21st, 2023 a group of men and women dedicated to honoring



fallen service members braved the cold and rain to fulfill their mission. The group placed 85 wreaths at the Vietnam Wall at the Missouri National Veterans Memorial in Perryville, MO to honor 85 members of the U.S. Naval Construction Battalions, otherwise known as the Seabees for the initials CB.

Leading the effort (pictured on left) was Ronald A. Rathert of Chester, IL a retired Command Master Chief who served two deployments in Vietnam with NMCB-58 otherwise known as The Great 58.

Rathert was joined by fellow servicemen and his daughter Elenore Clendenin and Christ our Savior Lutheran High School students Josh and Issac Sims.

The effort was part of Wreaths Across America, which provides wreaths to be placed on Veterans graves and memorials throughout the country. With donations from Rathert, 10 fellow veterans of The Great 58, (CEC Ernest Hall, EO2 Carl Roberts, CE2 Jim Nunn, BU3 Geary Smith, BU3 Robert Delany, UT2 Terry Styx, BU2 Paul Dalton, BU3 Bob Musgrove, BM3 Bob McGrew and LT Charles March) as well as local donors BU3 Danny Hornbostal, and EO3 Mike Stallman of Chester, BU3 Mike Bierman of Steelville and BU3 Mike Rathert of Ava, the group purchased 100 wreaths.



After 85 wreaths were laid at the Vietnam Wall, the remaining 15 were taken to veterans' memorials throughout the area, including those in Rockwood and Legion, VFW, and Gazebo Park in Chester.

Placement of the wreaths coincided with the wreath ceremony at the Missouri National Veterans Memorial, in which veterans from each branch placed wreaths at the Honor Flag Memorial adjacent to the James M. Eddleman Military Museum.

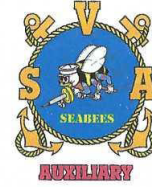

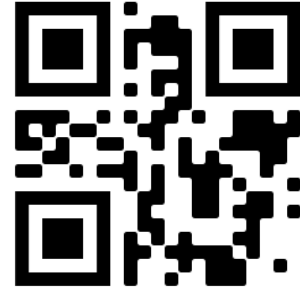
